

Ordinary Options and Seasonal Propers

The liturgy has fixed and variable components. The Ordinary is the fixed order, the Propers those texts which vary with the season. In modern times the Ordinary has become more flexible; and has offered options unrelated to the variations of the season.

This booklet contains both the ordinary options, and the seasonal propers. It is primarily to provide the celebrant with necessary texts when the congregation is using the triple-fold card "Holy Eucharist"; but it will also provide much variety in support of the triple-fold card "Divine Service": and it will be of value when the fuller booklets are in use.

The Collects and readings are not printed here. They are provided in the current edition of "Sunday Readings", or by resorting to an officially printed Common Worship Lectionary.

Here are included Eucharistic Prayers B and E, which may take one of the extended prefaces printed; and Prayers F and G which have invariable prefaces.

The pages of this book may be usefully copied separately and used in a loose leaf Altar book tailored to the needs of a particular church or chaplain.

Seeing we have a great high priest who has passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us draw near with a true heart, in full assurance of faith, and make our confession to our heavenly Father.

What God has prepared for those who love him, he has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything. Therefore, let us in penitence open our hearts to the Lord, who has prepared good things for those who love him.
