Children are always welcome in our Church. At the back of the Church there are some activity bags, containing quiet toys and colouring books—please help yourself! We want you to enjoy worship so please don't worry if the children make a noise.

It is our practice, before the service begins, and especially after the candles have been lit, to keep the church as quiet and still as possible so that everyone can prepare to worship God 'in spirit and in truth'. Please pray for all involved in leading our worship, and for those sitting near you. You may like to use the 'Prayers before worship' on the following pages.

Easter is the greatest of all the Christian festivals. It celebrates the love of God for us in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It speaks to us of God doing a new and unexpected thing; of new life bursting from the tomb. The Shape of Baptism: The Rite of Christian Initiation

To know Christ sacramentally only in terms of bread and wine is to know him only partially, in the dining room as host and guest. It is a valid enough knowledge, but its ultimate weakness when isolated is that it is perhaps too civil... However elegant the knowledge of the dining room may be, it begins in the soil, in the barnyard, in the slaughterhouse; amid the quiet violence of the garden, strangled cries, and fat spitting in the pan. Table manners depend on something's having been grabbed by the throat. A knowledge that ignores these dark and murderous human gestes is losing its grip on the human condition.

Prayers of Penitence

A minister invites the people to confess using these or similar words

When the Lord comes, he will bring to light the things now hidden in darkness, and will disclose the purposes of the heart.

Therefore in the light of Christ let us confess our sins.

Each communicant replies **Amen**. Please wait until the person on your left has received the chalice before leaving the altar.

After all have received, silence is kept.

to the glory of God the Father.

The Gloria may be said or sung

All Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.

Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Collect

We keep a moment of silence to collect our thoughts and concerns before the president says the Collect, which reflects a theme of the season. All respond

All Amen.

The Liturgy of the Word _

Readings

We sit for the readings from Scripture. At the end the reader may say

This is the word of the Lord.

All Thanks be to God.

A hymn or a Psalm is sung. We turn to face the minister for the Gospel of the Day.

At Communion

Whether I kneel or stand or sit in prayer, I am not caught in time nor held in space, but thrust beyond this posture I am where time and eternity come face to face; infinity and space meet in this place where crossbar and high upright hold the one in agony and in all Love's embrace. The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us.

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break the bread of life, and that life is the light of the world.

All God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us to light and life.

The Agnus Dei may be used as the bread is broken.

The Christian journey through life is rather like pole-vaulting - blindfold. First they blindfold you, then you are allowed to select a pole. Armed with what you consider is a strong and suitable implement, you set off running in what you hope is the right direction. Sermon

We sit for the Sermon, after which there is a brief silence. On Sundays and Principal Holy Days we then stand to affirm our faith.

Affirmation of Faith

Let us declare our faith in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

All Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; he was buried; he was raised to life on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; afterwards he appeared to his followers, and to all the apostles: this we have received, and this we believe. Amen.

This is his/our story

Hope and Suffering

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

The president introduces the Peace with a suitable sentence, and then says

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

We may exchange the Peace with those around us by shaking hands.

Preparation of the Table Taking of the Bread and Wine

A hymn is sung, during which the altar is prepared and a collection may be taken. The gifts of bread and wine are brought from the people and placed upon the altar.

The following prayers may be used.

Generous God, creator, redeemer, sustainer, at your table we present this money, symbol of the work you have given us to do; use it, use us, in the service of your world to the glory of your name.

All Amen.

Be present, be present, Lord Jesus Christ, our risen high priest; make yourself known in the breaking of bread.

All Amen

The president takes the bread and wine.
